Smart-smarter/ young-younger/ fast- faster	One syllable adjectives. Rule 1: Simply add "er"
Wet-wetter / big-bigger/ sad- sadder	One syllable adjectives with a Consonant- Vowel- Consonant Pattern. Rule 2: double the "consonant" and add "er" .
Pretty- prettier/ happy-happier/ busy – busier	Adjectives ending in Y Rule 3: change the Y to i and add er
Famous-more famous, interesting-more interesting, modern-more modern	Adjectives with two or more syllables. Rule 4: Use the word "more" before the adjective.
Good-better/ bad-worse/ far-farther (further)	These are irregular words. So.. NO rule!!! (fortunately, there are only a few).

We use “as...as” to make a comparison of the similarities of two items or to say that those items are equal and we use “not as ... as” to say that two items are not equal.

adjective	Affirmative as...as	Negative not as...as	example
Short adjective	As hard as	Not as fast as	Math is as hard as Chemistry. (Math is hard and Chemistry is hard) A card is not as fast as a plane. (A plane is super-fast; a car is not super-fast).
Long adjective	As beautiful as	Not as difficult as	Carol is as beautiful as Naomi. (Carol is beautiful and Naomi is Beautiful). English is not as difficult as math. (Math is difficult; English is not difficult).
Irregular adjective	as good as	Not as far as	Swimming is as good as running. (both exercises are good for being healthy). Canada is not as far as Australia. (Australia is far; Canada is not far).
